"Seven More Judgments"

*"Great and marvelous are your deeds,
Lord God Almighty. Just and true are your ways,
King of the ages." Revelation 15:3b–4*

A. "Before me was the Lamb"...

1. There are 144,000 with a mark of security!
2. They are singing a new song!
3. They are pure and without blemish because they were purchased!

B. The three angels...

1. The first angel brings the message of salvation.
2. The second angel brings a message of doom.
3. The third angel brings a message of judgment.
4. A great harvest will happen!

C. The seven bowls of God's wrath...

1. The first angel poured out his judgment of ugly and painful sores on those with the mark of the beast.
2. The second angel poured out his judgment of blood in the sea killing every living thing.
3. The third angel poured out his judgment of blood on the rivers and springs of water.
4. The fourth angel poured out his judgment of a scorching sun with fire.

5. The fifth angel poured out his judgment of darkness onto the earth.
6. The sixth angel poured out his judgment of a dried up Euphrates riverbed preparing the way for battle.
7. The seventh angel poured out his judgment with a voice declaring, "It is done!" A great earthquake, like never before, destroys islands and mountains and 100 pound hailstones hit the earth.

D. Man's response...

1. When the fourth angel poured out his judgment... they refused to repent!
"They were seared by the intense heat and they cursed God, who had control over these plagues, but they refused to repent and glorify him."
2. When the fifth angel poured out his judgment... they refused to repent!
"Men gnawed their tongues in agony and cursed the God of heaven because of their pains and their sores, but they refused to repent of what they had done."
3. When the seventh angel poured out his judgment... they cursed God!
"And they cursed God on account of the plague of hail, because the plague was so terrible."

E. When trials come to your life, how do you respond?

1. Trials come to our lives to make us strong!
"So be truly glad. There is wonderful joy ahead, even though you must endure many trials for a little while. These trials will show that your faith is genuine. It is being tested as fire tests and purifies gold—though your faith is far more precious than mere gold. So when your faith remains strong through many trials, it will bring you much praise and glory and honor on the day when Jesus Christ is revealed to the whole world." 1 Peter 1:6–7
2. Trials come to all of us.
"Dear friends, don't be surprised at the fiery trials you are going through, as if something strange were happening to you." 1 Peter 4:12

3. Trials are painful.
"No discipline is enjoyable while it is happening—it's painful! But afterward there will be a peaceful harvest of right living for those who are trained in this way." Hebrews 12:11
4. Trials are temporary.
"In his kindness God called you to share in his eternal glory by means of Christ Jesus. So after you have suffered a little while, he will restore, support, and strengthen you, and he will place you on a firm foundation." 1 Peter 5:10
5. Whatever the trial, it will be worth it!
"For our present troubles are small and won't last very long. Yet they produce for us a glory that vastly outweighs them and will last forever!" 2 Corinthians 4:17
6. Trials help us to become like Jesus.
"So all of us who have had that veil removed can see and reflect the glory of the Lord. And the Lord—who is the Spirit—makes us more and more like him as we are changed into his glorious image." 2 Corinthians 3:18
7. Trials come and must be received with a heart that trusts God!
"Dear brothers and sisters, when troubles of any kind come your way, consider it an opportunity for great joy. For you know that when your faith is tested, your endurance has a chance to grow. 4 So let it grow, for when your endurance is fully developed, you will be perfect and complete, needing nothing." James 1:2–4
8. Trials come for us to be a witness to our world.
"So God can point to us in all future ages as examples of the incredible wealth of his grace and kindness toward us, as shown in all he has done for us who are united with Christ Jesus." Ephesians 2:7
"so that no one can criticize you. Live clean, innocent lives as children of God, shining like bright lights in a world full of crooked and perverse people." Philippians 2:15
9. Trials come and our goal must be that we will let the light of Jesus shine!
"But he knows where I am going. And when he tests me, I will come out as pure as gold." Job 23:10
