1 Thessalonians 5:11

A. Encourage one another...

"But encourage one another daily, as long as it is called 'Today,' so that none of you may be hardened by sin's deceitfulness."

Hebrews 3:13

- 1. Is defined (in a biblical context): "To give <u>courage</u> to; to give or increase confidence of success; to inspire with courage, spirit, or strength of mind; to embolden; to animate; to incite; to inspirit. A calling to one's aid." To put courage into! (The definition of the work of the Holy Spirit) Paraclete is the Greek word meaning "to lay alongside."
- 2. Is putting courage in the <u>heart</u> of one when life is rough.

"And we urge you, brothers and sisters, warn those who are idle and disruptive, <u>encourage the disheartened</u>, help the weak, be patient with everyone." 1 Thessalonians 5:11

 Is focused more on <u>affirmation</u> than appreciation. Appreciation is more performance-based but affirmation is deeper. "Therefore, brothers and sisters, in all our distress and persecution we were encouraged about you because of your faith." 1 Thessalonians 3:7

4. Is a spiritual <u>gift</u>, but, it is also commanded for all of us to follow.

"if it is to encourage, then give encouragement..." Romans 12:8 "Therefore encourage one another with these words." 1 Thessalonians 4:18

B. <u>Discouragement</u>...

"We sent Timothy, who is our brother and co-worker in God's service in spreading the gospel of Christ, to strengthen and encourage you in your faith," 1 Thessalonians 3:2

- 1. Is the enemy's way to attack our <u>faith!</u>
- 2. Happens when there is a <u>loss</u> of initial excitement.
- 3. Happens when there are delays.
- 4. Happens with criticism.
- 5. Comes with opposition.
- 6. Can be found with <u>pessimism</u>, comparisons, and faulty expectations.
- 7. Can be experienced by a wrong view of success.

"May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and by his grace gave us eternal encouragement and good hope," 2 Thessalonians 2:16

C. So, let's <u>practice</u> encouragement...

1. Because this is what Jesus <u>commands</u> us to do.

"Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing." 1 Thessalonians 5:11

2. Because it gives spiritual <u>strength</u> to one another.

"Judas and Silas, who themselves were prophets, said much to encourage and strengthen the believers." Acts 15:32

3. Because it helps <u>create</u> a spiritual family.

"After Paul and Silas came out of the prison, they went to Lydia's house, where they met with the brothers and sisters and encouraged them. Then they left." Acts 16:40

4. Because failing to do so <u>results</u> in discouragement!

"My goal is that they may be encouraged in heart and united in love, so that they may have the full riches of complete understanding, in order that they may know the mystery of God, namely Christ," Colossians 2:2

D. Who will you encourage today?

"not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching." Hebrews 10:25

- 1. Give encouragement through words to someone who has invested in your life.
- 2. Give spiritual strength and courage to someone through affirmation.
- 3. Give sincere and truthful encouragement through actions. ____
- 4. Give encouragement to someone who is going through hardship or struggles by prayer and a tangible act._____
- 5. Give consistent encouragement on a regular basis.

—James MacDonald God is in control. He is sovereign ... even in our pain, even in our troubles. Through it all, His love is transforming us, perfecting us, completing us.

James 1:2-4 "Dear brothers and sisters, when troubles come your way, consider it an opportunity for great joy. For you know that when your faith is tested, your endurance has a chance to grow. So let it grow, for when your endurance is fully developed, you will be perfect and complete, needing nothing."

What Are Some Practical Ways We Can Encourage One Another?

Kind Words—affirmation, sincere praise, apology, empathetic, active listening and constructive feedback. Body language—cheerful look, smile, laughter Godly example—the most powerful source. Physical touch—when appropriate Providing hope—seeing a brighter future. Providing personal help and practical assistance Assuring others of your prayers for them. Personal Challenge to grow. Spur one another to love and good deeds. Inspiring stories/examples. Remembering events. Giving to others—adding value to their lives. Sharing appropriate Scripture with others. Expressing appreciation. Rewarding accomplishments. Spreading good gossip. Caring, thoughtful, considerate actions. God's Word—especially His promises. Our position in Christ. Unselfishly meeting needs. Empathizing with the hurting. Rejoicing with those who rejoice. Persuading others to trust/follow Christ. Exhort to persevere—to continue in the faith. Cheer up the faint-hearted. Invitation to respond to the Gospel. Providing solace and consolation. Comfort and relieve those in distress. Urge on toward holiness.
