“When your days are fulfilled and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come from your body, and I will establish His kingdom.”
2 Samuel 7:12 (ESV)

A. God’s promise fulfilled

1. Matthew 1:1-17

“Thus there were fourteen generations in all from Abraham to David, fourteen from David to the exile to Babylon, and fourteen from the exile to the Messiah.” Matthew 1:17 (NIV)

2. Luke 3:23-38 (Genealogy)

3. Angel to Mary

“He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David, and He will reign over the house of Jacob forever; His kingdom will never end.”
Luke 1:32-33 (NIV)

4. The Priest Zechariah

“Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, because He has come and has redeemed His people. He has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of His servant David.” Luke 1:68-69 (NIV)

5. The Apostle Paul

“the gospel He promised beforehand through His prophets in the Holy Scriptures regarding His Son, who as to His earthly life was a descendent of David.” Romans 1:2-3a (NIV)

6. Jesus Christ

“I, Jesus, have sent My angel to give you this testimony for the churches. I am the Root and the Offspring of David, and the Morning Star.” Revelation 22:16 (NIV)

B. The foreshadow of Christ through David

1. The Battles

a. David and Goliath

“If he is able to fight and kill me, we will become your subjects; but if I overcome him and kill him, you will become our subjects and serve us.” 1 Sam. 17:9 (NIV)

b. Jesus and Satan

“At once the Spirit sent Him out into the wilderness, and He was tempted by Satan.” Mark 1:12-13a (NIV)

2. The Foundations

a. David and the Temple

“And my son Solomon the wholehearted devotion to keep your demands, statutes and decrees and to do everything to build the palatial structure for which I have provided.” 1 Chronicles 29:19 (NIV)

b. Jesus and the Church

“In Him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord.” Ephesians 2:21 (NIV)

3. The Works

a. David as Priest and King

“David built an altar to the Lord there and sacrificed burnt offerings and fellowship offerings. Then the Lord answered prayer in behalf of the land, and the plague on Israel was stopped.” 2 Sam. 24:25 (NIV)

b. Jesus as Priest and King

“But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near through the blood of Christ.” Ephesians 2:13 (NIV)

Additional Notes:

C. A king seeking the King’s heart

“After removing Saul, He made David their king. God testified concerning him: ‘I have found David son of Jesse a man after My own heart; he will do everything I want him to do.’” Acts 13:22 (NIV)

1. God’s fame

“The LORD is my shepherd, I lack nothing. He takes me to lush pastures; He leads me to refreshing water. He restores my strength. He leads me down the right paths for the sake of His reputation.”
Psalm 23:1-3 (NET)

2. God’s heart

“Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me from Your presence or take Your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of Your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.” Psalm 51:10-12 (NIV)

3. God’s purpose

“Then I said, ‘Here I am, I have come—it is written about me in the scroll. I desire to do Your will, my God; Your law is within my heart.’”
Psalm 40:7-8 (NIV)

Additional Notes:

King David and King Jesus' Similar Lives

1. **King David** was born in Bethlehem (1 Sam. 16:18). **Jesus** was born in Bethlehem (Luke 2:4-7).
2. **David** was appointed king by God (1 Sam. 6:1). **Jesus** was born King and sent by God the Father (Matt. 2:2, Acts 2:34-36).
3. **David** was a shepherd and became king (1 Sam. 16:11). **Jesus** came as both King and Shepherd (John 10:11).
4. **David** refused to be made king before God's time (1 Sam. 24:4-7, 18, 26:8-9). **Jesus** refused to reign as King before God's time (John 6:15).
5. **David** brought peace and security to physical Israel (2 Sam. 8:6, 14, 1 Chron. 8:6). **Jesus** brought peace and security to spiritual Israel (Rom. 5:1, Eph. 2:14-15).
6. **David** was a king with whom God was well pleased (1 Sam. 13:14). **Jesus** is the King with whom God is well pleased (Matt. 13:17).
7. **David** gathered the low and despised into his kingdom (1 Sam. 22:1-2). **Jesus** gathers the low and despised into His kingdom (1 Cor. 1:27-28).
8. When the enemy pursues **David**, few of his people follow him (2 Sam. 15:14). When **Jesus** was taken, his friends scattered (Matt. 26:56).
9. **David** was 30 years old when he became king (2 Sam. 5:4). **Jesus** began His public ministry at 30 years of age (Luke 2:23).
10. **David** reigned from Jerusalem over all Israel for 33 years (2 Sam. 5:5). **Jesus** was King from birth (Matt. 2:2), and lived for 33 years.
